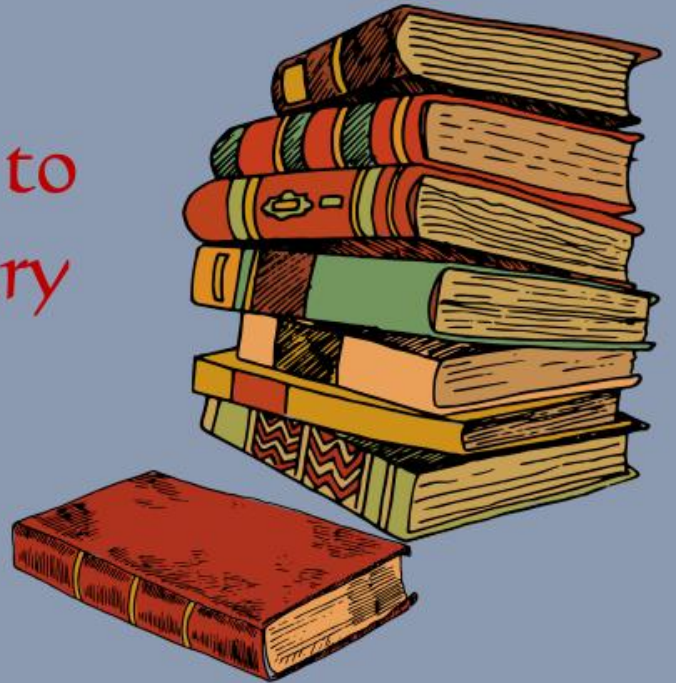

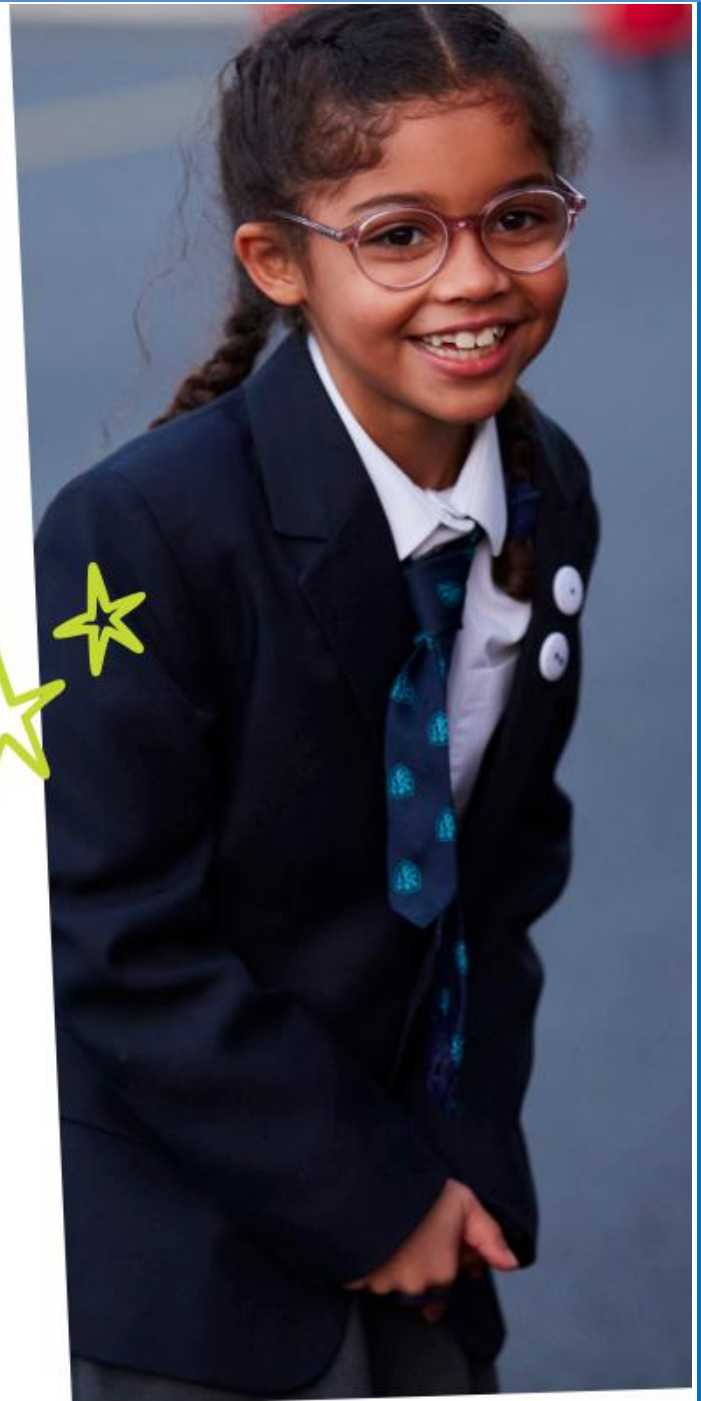

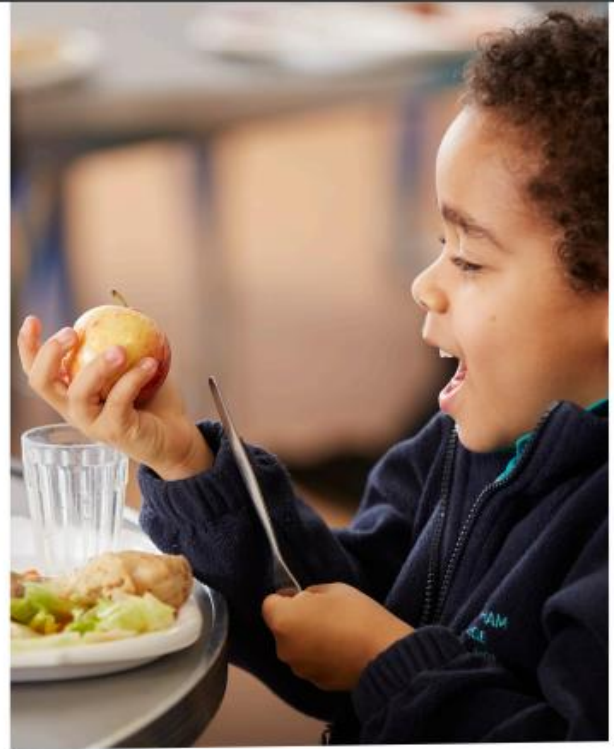
Q. Will Premier be taking payments via childcare vouchers?
