# The Role of Foundation Governors

Our Foundation Governors are appointed by the Bishop to preserve and develop the religious character of the school, and to secure compliance with the trust deed.

To be a Foundation Governor is to accept a ministry in the Church, to be concerned not only with the good of a particular school but with the good of the whole educational mission of the Diocese of East Anglia. Through his Foundation Governors the Bishop discharges his responsibility to ensure that:

- a) as far as possible, teachers are appointed to our schools who combine personal conviction and practice of the Faith with the educational qualifications required for particular posts;
- b) a just admissions policy is framed, consonant with the Catholic character of the school and the needs of our children;
- c) the curriculum is rooted in a religious understanding of life so that religious education has first place in the curriculum and embraces and enlivens every other subject;
- d) the property of the Trustee is cared for and used for its proper purposes.

Foundation Governors have the task of preserving and developing the Catholic ethos of our schools and their partnership with the wider community. It is an excellent example of that vision of collaborative ministry given us in the teachings of the church.
