On 14th September, the Catholic Church in England and Wales will observe Education Sunday, which this year occurs on the same day as the liturgical Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

It is amazing how quickly we get back into the routine of school life after the summer holidays. The children have settled extremely well and already working really hard in their new classes. Our new reception children have now been in school full time for a whole week and I have loved going in there to see how well they are getting on, making friends and loving the dressing up outfits!!

This month we are once again busy preparing for our Community Fun Day and I would like to thank you for your support so far with the very generous donations you made today for the bottle tombola. We want people in our local community to come and see St. Martha's and all we have to offer. The day will have lots of different stalls from local businesses and school led stalls as well as offering tours of the school for prospective families. We would love for you all to join us on the day and bring all your friends and family . . . everyone is welcome. If anyone would like to volunteer to help on the day setting up or running a stall, please do get in touch. We are also on the hunt for some good raffle prizes, so if you or your know anyone who runs/owns a business and would like to donate a raffle prize, we would be extremely grateful. Raffle tickets will go on sale next Friday.

Next Friday, we will hold another non uniform day for those that wish to participate. We are asking for donations for our 'Jolly Jars' tombola. Please remember that donations are completely optional and only if you are able to. Please do not feel you have to donate every week or at all. Children can wear non uniform or school uniform - it is up to them.

Please can I remind all KS2 parents, that children can bring a snack in for breaktime. The snack should be as healthy as possible and limited to one item. It is vital that you do not bring any items of food into school which contains nuts . . . please do check anything that has chocolate spread in it.

All children should bring a named water bottle to school. I do not mind children having squash but they should not have fizzy drinks.

I will be sending out in a separate Dojo post information regarding attendance and penalty notices for unauthorised absences. Please remember that the guidelines clearly state that I cannot authorise holidays. If you are requesting a leave of absence for a particular reason e.g. wedding, baptism etc, please attach evidence of the event with your leave of absence form. Thank you.

We understand that many of you are friends with members of staff in school but please could I ask that you follow the correct lines of communication so that boundaries do not get blurred. Please contact teachers through Dojo regarding ay school matters. Any personal communication should be done through other means. Thank you for your cooperation.

Unfortunately, I received a message from a disgruntled resident complaining of parents blocking her driveway at drop off and pick up times. Please could I ask you all to be mindful of the residents when you are parking your car.

We are continuing to monitor the safety outside during pick up and would like to remind you that anyone waiting with a bike before the gates open should wait at the drop off zone. Anyone waiting by the wooden gates should line up along the fences either side in single file so that people can get past. Many thanks your continued support in this matter and we will update you all as soon as we have any further suggestions.
